Bayeux Tapestry

It is an embroidered cloth nearly 70 metres long and 50 centimetres tall, which depicts the events of the Battle of Hastings. It is thought to date to the 11th century, within a few years after the battle. It tells the story from the point of view of the conquering Normans, but is now agreed to have been made in England.
