WALT: complete arithmetic questions.

$$\frac{1}{2} \text{ of } 6 = 3$$



$$\frac{1}{2} \text{ of } 10 = 5$$



$$\frac{1}{2} \text{ of } 12 = 6$$



$$\frac{1}{2} \text{ of } 16 = 8$$



$$\frac{1}{3} \text{ of } 9 = 3$$



$$\frac{1}{3} \text{ of } 15 = 5$$



$$\frac{1}{3} \text{ of } 21 = 7$$



$$\frac{1}{3} \text{ of } 18 = 6$$



$$\frac{1}{4} \text{ of } 12 = 3$$



$$\frac{1}{4} \text{ of } 20 = 5$$



$$\frac{1}{5} \text{ of } 20 = 4$$



$$\frac{1}{5} \text{ of } 0 = 0$$
