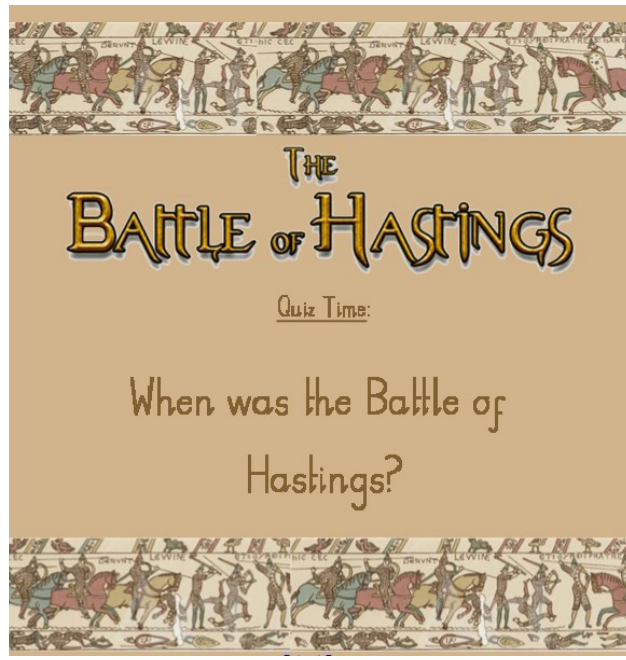

The BATTLE of HASTINGS

5th January 1066

King Edward of England (Edward the Confessor) died.



The BATTLE of HASTINGS

6th January 1066

Harry Godwinson is crowned the new King of England.



News spread of King Harold's coronation. William of Normandy and Harold
Hardrada of Norway both planned to invade to take the throne.

The BATTLE of HASTINGS

25th September 1066

Harold Hardrada arrives in England with his men in a
fleet of 300 Viking longships. Harold Godwinson's army
marches North.



The BATTLE of HASTINGS

25th September 1066

They defeat the Vikings at the Battle of Stamford Bridge.
Harold and King Harold's brother, Tostig, is killed.

THE BATTLE OF HASTINGS

27th September 1066

William of Normand, his fleet of 700 ships and his army land at Pevensey in Sussex, on the South coast of England. Harold's army march quickly south from Stamford Bridge.



THE BATTLE OF HASTINGS

14th October 1066

The two armies meet at Senlac Hill near Hastings. The Battle of Hastings takes place. King Harold is killed and William of Normandy is victorious.
