

Behaviour Expectations at Reddal

Hill:

At Reddal Hill, we believe that good discipline comes from a stimulating and exciting curriculum and we strive hard to provide this. However, we also acknowledge the need for a behaviour policy in order to sustain a consistent approach.

We firmly believe in creating a positive environment where children can succeed and enjoy their success.

'Positive encouragement is our aim.'

Where negative behaviours are shown, sanctions are given and parents will be informed.

We continually review and refine our policy to show clearly to children and parents how we view behaviour at our school.

Our School Rules

To try to:

1. Follow instructions first time.
2. Choose your words and actions carefully
3. Use kind hands and feet.
4. Show respect to everyone.

REDDAL HILL RESPECTS EVERYONE AT ALL TIMES

At the beginning of each new school term, the class teacher will discuss the rules and use them continuously to promote positive behaviour within the classroom.

All staff in the school use the school rules, not only in the classroom but before school (in the playground and breakfast club), playtime, lunchtime and after school (in the playground).

The Midday Supervisory Assistants are acting on behalf of the Headteacher and are regarded as **full** members of staff. Children must demonstrate the same level of respect for all adults who work at the school.

REWARDS:

Rewards have been devised for the whole school and are as follows;

Stickers

Certificates

Move up the Zone Board

V.I.P. (Very Important **Pupil**). When a child has shown exceptional behavior, they are chosen by their teacher as the V.I.P. in their class, for the following week. This is awarded in an assembly where parents are invited to come and celebrate their child's achievement.

Behaviour Champion events

Reddal Hill Reward Stars

Postcards sent home

Monster points/Dajos — This is an online programme where staff can reward children for positive behaviour.

Informing parents — a letter home / phone call.

Even though we strongly promote a positive behaviour policy at Reddal Hill, we also agree that there should be consequences when significant negative behaviour occurs. Therefore, we have a Reflection Room where children who have shown **unacceptable** behaviours, can sit and reflect on their actions. Please see our full school policy for the types of behaviour and consequences given. If negative behaviours are becoming a regular occurrence, we will invite parents in to discuss this, and a child will be encouraged to change their behaviour with the support of a Review Card.

Zone Boards:

Each classroom has a Zone Board. This board consists of six colours, which all have a specific reward or consequence. Every day, each child starts in the green zone. Where positive behaviours are shown, children move up the zone board to silver and then gold. If negative behaviour is shown, the children move down the zone board to blue, orange and then red.

GOLD— You're a super star today

Reddal Hill Reward Star (Stamp)

*contact with parents (postcard, phone call or verbally at the end of the day)

SILVER- You're doing great today

Sticker

GREEN- You're following our school rules

BLUE—Check your behaviour

Verbal discussion with the adult involved.

ORANGE - Your behaviour is not acceptable

KS1 – 3 minutes missed playtime

KS2 – 5 minutes missed playtime

RED—Your behaviour has continued to be unacceptable

KS1 – 5 minutes missed playtime

KS2 – 10 minutes missed playtime

RED SUPPORT CARD – Removal from the classroom

Behaviour Champions:

At Reddal Hill, we believe that pupils who display consistently positive behaviour should be recognised and commended. We encourage all pupils to strive to become a Behaviour Champion.

Bronze Behaviour Champion

A pupil who shows consistent positive behaviour for a whole term will be deemed a Bronze Behaviour Champion. These pupils will receive a certificate during the end of term Praise Assembly, and they will also be rewarded with an additional one-hour awesome playtime in the school playground.

Silver Behaviour Champion

A pupil who shows consistently positive behaviour across two terms will be deemed a Silver Behaviour Champion. These pupils will receive a certificate during the end of term Praise Assembly, and they will have a reward of a half day amazing trip to the local park.

Gold Behaviour Champion

A pupil who shows consistently positive behaviour across three terms will be a Gold Behaviour Champion. These pupils will receive a certificate during the end of term Praise Assembly, and they will have a reward of an astounding adventure trip for a whole day.
