Fable

WALT: plan our own fable

Using the planning format that you looked at last week, you need to plan your own fable using different characters from the original fable. Look at how the Kangaroo and the Porpoise was planned for inspiration.

Story Structure	What happens?	The Kangaroo and the Porpoise	Your fable: _____
Opening	This is where we are introduced to the characters and setting ✓ Remember your rule of 3	The story is introduced as an old tale told by Grandad. We meet the characters of kangaroo and porpoise. Porpoise is friendly, caring and kind hearted. Kangaroo is sly, cunning and selfish.	
Build up	This is where we find out a little bit more about the characters and the situation they are in.	Both kangaroo and porpoise have babies. When they go hunting, the other character looks after the baby for them. When porpoise hunts, she takes a long time and her baby starts to cry.	

Problem	What goes wrong for our characters? Why are they arguing?	When porpoise gets back from hunting, kangaroo refuses to give her baby back. This is because the porpoises' baby is much prettier than kangaroo's baby.	
Resolution	How do they solve the problem?	The kangaroo and the porpoise fight. The porpoise gets hit on the head. The kangaroo's arms are broken so she hops off with the porpoises' baby in her pouch. The kangaroo baby gets thrown into a tree.	
Ending	- What happens to our characters at the end of the story? - How does the ending link back to the start?	The porpoise now lives in the sea and spurts water out of her head. The kangaroo's arms are really short so they carry their babies in a pouch.
