Repetition—When you repeat something in a poem, this is called "repetition." Repetition helps draw the reader's attention to a thought, idea, or feeling. It can make the main idea of the poem more memorable.
What words and ideas are repeated in the poem?
Adjectives - Words that describe nouns a person, place or object to paint a better picture in the readers mind. E.g. silver hair. Silver is the adjective as it describes the alien's hair. Find three adjectives in the poem.
Comparisons— comparing/contrasting 2 themes or ideas to highlight the differences or similarities between them. E.g. soft or scaly. Find three comparisons in the poem.
