Actions as a result of feedback:

Nursery:

At home time, the safe dismissal of our pupils is always our first priority. We will ensure that parents are aware that they can wait around if they wish to speak to a member of staff. A small number of nursery pupils are currently displaying challenging behaviours. These pupils have been observed by KB and additional EIG funding will be applied for. A second workshop has already been delivered and a large percentage of parents stayed for an hour.

Year 2:

We will deliver a maths and curriculum inspire workshop later in the year; during the workshops, teachers will model and explain key concepts and skills.

Planet points are awarded each and every time a child completes a piece of homework. If extra homework projects are completed, these are celebrated in class and evidenced on the website.

Year 4:

A document will be added to the English section of the school website to explain how the book band colours correspond to year group and reading age expectations.

We will ensure that maths homework, where appropriate, will provide a calculation example modelling 'How to complete the task'.

Year 6:

JS (AHT: Maths Lead) is available to support parents with homework, as and when requested. This will be shared at next terms INSPIRE sessions.
