Dear Parents / Carers,

To respond to our pupils' current needs, we will be delivering the PSHE 'Changing Me' unit of work this half term. As you will be aware, the 'Changing Me' unit of work includes the mandatory puberty and health education learning that is outlined in the government's Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) and Health Education document. (You can find a copy of this document on the school website).

It is important for all pupils, from Year 1 upwards, to name body parts using the correct scientific terminology and understand the changes that their body may go through in an age appropriate manner. Puberty and health education are mandatory and pupils cannot be withdrawn from any of these lessons. For further information regarding what will be taught, take a look at the PSHE information on the school website.

Year 4 pupils have an additional lesson, which is not mandatory, but is still recommended teaching. This covers human reproduction. The lesson is entitled 'Having a Baby' and focuses on the internal and external parts of a male and female body and the personal choice of having a baby. It DOES NOT cover the process of child birth. To help you understand what your child will be learning, I would like to invite you to a **parents / carers' meeting on Wednesday 9th March at 9am in the hall**, where I will share the content of this additional session, and there will be an opportunity for you to discuss any concerns or worries. If, after the meeting, you still feel that you do not want your child to take part in this additional teaching session, then a meeting will be arranged for you to speak directly with Mrs. Bashir-Pugh, to share your concerns.
