At Reddal Hill, we have a school uniform that children have to wear, we believe that a school uniform is important because:

- It looks smart;
- It makes children feel equal to their peers in terms of appearance;
- It reflects the ethos of a school;
- It provides a sense of belonging and identity;
- It sets an appropriate tone for education.

We ask that all children wear the uniform and encourage them to maintain a good standard of clean and tidy dress in school.

The uniform is designed to be practical, maintainable and good value for money. We do have logo jumpers and cardigans available for purchase at a reasonable cost, however non-logo uniform can also be worn.

For safety reasons we ask that the children do not wear jewellery in school other than simple stud earrings and a simple wristwatch (no smart watches).

Uniform

Our uniform consists of the following:

- Royal blue jumper or cardigan (logo or non-logo)
- White or blue polo t-shirt
- Grey or black trousers, shorts*, skirt or pinafore
- Blue gingham dress*
- Black, grey or white socks

PE Kit consists of white t-shirt, black or navy shorts and black pumps. PE kit should be brought to school in a named PE bag at the start of the term and kept in school.

Hair accessories such as slides, ribbons bobbles, can be worn, these should be fairly simple and if possible in school colours (blue, black, grey or white).

Head scarves / hijab can also be worn. These can be either blue, black, grey or white.

Parents are asked to ensure that all items are labelled clearly with their child's name.
