Title	How to catch a wolf	How to catch a rabbit
Bullet points	• a net • a rope • a cardboard box • a toy rabbit	• a box • some string • a fresh crunchy carrot • a blanket
Time connectives	First, Next, After that, Finally.	First, Then, After, Lastly.
Imperative verbs	Make, push, lie, place, pull, scoop.	Lift, raise, yank, bind, fasten, join, create, build.
Concluding sentence	Be careful and don't feed it!	Be alert and don't stroke it!
