- determiners (word placed in front of a noun to specify quantity or to clarify what the noun refers to)
- -nouns (names a person, place, thing, idea, action or quality)
- -verbs (words used to describe an action)
- -adjectives (words used to describe a noun)

You need to find the determiner, adjective, noun and verb.


Four dogs chased the bone.
