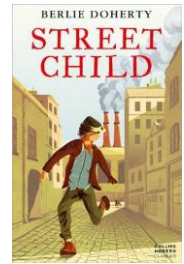

Adverbials are words or phrases that give more information to the sentence. A fronted adverbial is when the adverbial word or phrase is moved to the front of the sentence.
