<u>WALT</u>: use subordinating conjunctions.

Use the subordinating conjunctions 'although', 'because' and 'when to connect two sentences together.

Example:

Sentence I: George knew something wasn't right.

Sentence 2: He found more than he had bargained for under his mother's favourite chicken.

Sentence with conjunction in:

George knew something wasn't right <u>when</u> he found more than he had bargained for under his mother's favourite chicken.

Task: Connect these sentences together with a subordinating conjunction.

- 1. George was very sad. He thought he would never see his dragon again. (because)
- 2. George had never been a mother before. He knew that it was his duty to teach the dragon dragony ways. (although)
- 3. The dragon gave a chirrup of delight. The dragon saw George. (when)
