WALT: use subordinating conjunctions.

Use the subordinating conjunctions 'although', 'because' and 'when' to connect two sentences together.

Example:

Sentence 1 : George knew something wasn't right.

Sentence 2: He found more than he had bargained for under his mother's favourite chicken.

Sentence with conjunction in:

George knew something wasn't right when he found more than he had bargained for under his mother's favourite chicken.

Task: Connect these sentences together with a subordinating conjunction.

Rewrite the sentences using your best Kinetic Letter handwriting and remember your capital letters and full stops.

1. George was very sad. He thought he would never see his dragon again. (because)
2. George had never been a mother before. He knew that it was his duty to teach the dragon dragon ways. (although)
3. The dragon gave a chirrup of delight. The dragon saw George. (when)
